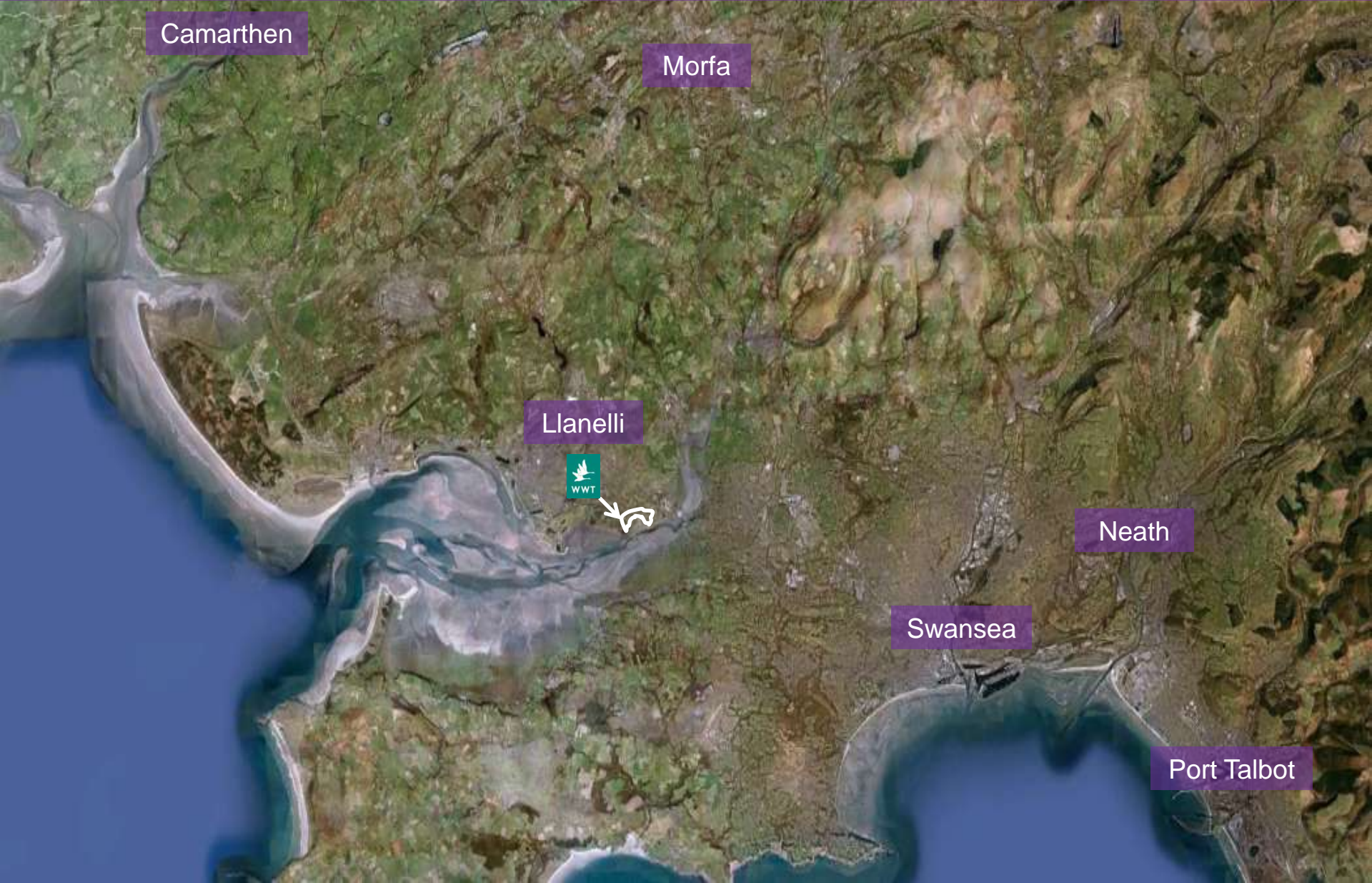

So what might you see when you get here?



Settlement pond

The flow of water is allowed to slow down over this large pool allowing larger particles to settle out. A layer of rich sediments has formed attracting ducks and swans for feeding.



Harvest bed

Varied treatment bed:

We planted these beds with different species and found that the mixed bed with a range of plants was best for wildlife and for water treatment. You can see that over time in our mixed bed, reed and reedmace have taken over. Look out for reed warbler, song warbler, reed bunting and water rail. Water vole nests have also been found along the edge of the it's bed.



Lagoon 1

The roots of marginal reeds and water lilies trap silt in the water to take up nutrients and trap sediment as the water flows past. Water voles have been seen nesting on these plants.
