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WWT LONDON WETLAND CENTRE IS GREAT FOR GROUPS!

WWT London Wetland Centre is a beautiful wildlife reserve and international award winning visitor attraction, close to central London, with coach parking facilities and

good public transport links. One of nine centres run by the Wildfowl & Wetlands Trust (WWT) the London Wetland Centre was voted Britain's *Favourite Nature Reserve* by *Countryfile* magazine readers in 2012. The site supports a wealth of wetland wildlife including colourful wild ducks, frogs, bats, a colony of water voles, lizards and migratory birds which arrive in large numbers from around the globe.

It is also a haven for people, whether watching the wildlife from one of the special viewing hides, relaxing in our gardens, enjoying a walk around the reserve or having a meal in the Water's Edge Cafe.



Prices

There is no upper limit on the size of group you can bring, but a minimum number of 12 paying people are required to receive the group admission price.

Guided tours

We can provide a general guided tour to discover more about the history of the Centre and its wildlife. A minimum two weeks' notice is required when booking these tours. Tours are provided at a charge of £25.00 and can accommodate up to 20 people, so if you have a very large group you may need to book more than one guide.

If you prefer to enjoy the centre at your own pace, a free map is available from admissions

to help you make the most of your visit. There will be staff and volunteers around the centre who will be happy to talk to you about the wildlife and exhibits and answer any queries you may have.

Eating and drinking

The Water's Edge Café and Courtyard cafe serve a selection of hot and cold food and drinks, including wine. This includes delicious soups, cakes, sandwiches, snacks and main meals including a vegetarian option.

We do ask groups to give us advance notice if they intend to eat in the cafe to allow the catering staff to provide an efficient and effective service. In the warmer months groups can also bring picnics to enjoy in the picnic areas in the grounds. To make things easier for your group, you can pre-book a delicious breakfast, lunch or cream tea.



Accessibility

is to make WWT London Wetland Centre accessible to everyone. Our reserve has flat paths, accessible toilet facilities and numerous benches. Our hides have level access and the two storey Peacock Tower has a lift. If you wish to hire a wheelchair (electric or manual), please contact us in advance and we will arrange this for you. Assistance dogs are permitted on site. Our car park has designated bays for blue badge holders, approximately 100m from the entrance. There are also disabled toilet facilities at the Centre.

Payment

One payment to cover admissions for the entire group and a tour must be made by the group leader. This can be done prior to the visit by cheque (made out to the Wildfowl & Wetlands Trust) or by cheque, cash or credit/debit card on the day.

A non-refundable deposit of 10% of the total value of any pre-booked catering must be made at least three days in advance by credit/debit card over the phone. We are unable to accept cheque payment for food and drink.
