You need not have been a charity trustee before, but you will have experience of participating at a senior level.

Together with the other Trustees on the Council, you will have ultimate responsibility for the strategic direction of the charity and for ensuring WWT is effectively delivering wetland conservation. You will ensure WWT complies with charity law and is well-run.

You will be willing and able to travel to WWT's sites around the UK for the quarterly meetings. This position is entirely voluntary and is therefore unpaid. Full travel and accommodation expenses will be reimbursed and applications from across the UK are welcome.
